### DAY 1: (LD) CANBERRA TO TRARALGON: Saturday 23 March 2019

After a welcomed lunch at the Walhalla Star Hotel, find yourself listening to the clank of the tracks tick by as you become enchanted by the wonderous scenery along the Walhalla Goldfields Railway (traveling from Walhalla to Thomas Station). Back at the hotel, we enjoy our dinner for the evening.
