The Bendigo Easter Festival is not to be missed. Over the four-day Easter long weekend, Bendigo's picturesque Rosalind Park and surrounding streets will be transformed into a vibrant precinct bustling with entertainment including live stage shows, hands-on activities, carnival rides, live music, roving performers and more! As the sun sets secure your place along the road to cheer on the convoy of illuminated floats concluding with a spectacular fireworks display over the city.

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### DAY 1 (LD): CANBERRA TO BENDIGO: Thursday 14 April 2022

Welcome to our 6 Day Easter Festival tour in Bendigo. Sit back, relax and meet your fellow Easter companions as we travel through scenic countryside and charming country towns such as Bowning, Coolac, Gundagai and Holbrook. There will be time for a quick morning tea break along the way before we reach Albury for our lunch stop. 'Stepping into The Ettamogah Pub is like stepping into a Ken Maynard cartoon! As a youngster Ken would cycle around a water hole called Ettamogah – an indigenous word meaning 'place of good drink'. This struck Ken as an ideal name for a pub and led to the infamous Ettamogah cartoons which encapsulate the essence of Australian larrikinism. There will be time to explore the pub and its walls of cartoons or wander through the cartoon inspired gardens. Back on the road we continue our journey on to Bendigo our home for the next 5 nights. As we get closer to the city centre we will see that Bendigo has one of the finest collections of Victorian buildings in Australia. The streets are awash with huge granite edifices and, in the centre of the city, there is a fountain dedicated to Queen Victoria's daughter-in-law, Princess Alexandra. After settling in to our contemporary accommodation at the All Seasons Resort Hotel we will unwind from the day over our evening meal at Seasons Bistro where we get to know our fellow travellers better.

### DAY 2: (BLD) BENDIGO EASTER FESTIVAL: Friday 15 April 2022

Ready for the day we board the 'Vintage Talking Tram' for a fascinating journey through central Bendigo where we see historic properties such as the Shamrock Hotel and delve a little into the history of the Goldfields. Step back in time and admire the craftsmanship and love that has gone into restoring each vehicle in the fleet. Bendigo Tramways pride themselves on operating the best working collection of heritage trams in the world. Our journey on board will leave us with a greater appreciation for why Bendigo's trams are such an important part of the city's identity. Alighting at the Central Deborah Gold Mine we have arranged a guided surface tour of an actual working mine - right in the centre of the city. Dominated by a huge 22 metre high poppet head, the surface of the mine is a highlight in itself and contains original buildings and equipment that were essential to the operation of Central Deborah in its mining days. You will be amazed by the Engine Room which contains the Winder that was installed in 1945 and is notable as the only complete working example in Australia. It is still used daily by the mine crew who meticulously maintain the underground workings. The surface also displays buildings and plant equipment from other mines that used to operate in Bendigo, including the Deborah Extended, South Deborah, North Deborah and Monument Hill Mines. We'll indulge in a traditional Miner's Pasty for lunch following our tour. Next up, we experience one of the main events of the festival - The Awakening of the Dragon\*, which is a spectacular celebration of dragon and lion dance, presented by the Bendigo Chinese Association. Returning to our accommodation we have time to relax before dinner and reflect on our unique experiences from today.

### DAY 3: (BLD) CASTLEMAINE AND EASTER FESTIVAL: Saturday 16 April 2022

After enjoying breakfast in the Seasons Bistro, we head the short distance to Woop-Woop, a unique sculpture garden and gallery based on Australian colloquialisms and humour located in the small central highlands town of Harcourt. Wander through the extensive garden adorned with over 100 sculptures depicting Australian sayings, unusual native 'plants', and 'Galvo Country', where three-dimensional figures mix with the 'local wildlife'. It will be a unique and interesting visit. It's then on to Castlemaine, a bustling town renowned for its eclectic arts scene, rich gold rush history, and growing reputation as a fine food destination. The centre of town has been virtually

unaltered since the 1860's when the surface gold was exhausted and is now home to on-trend and designer fashion, quirky vintage pieces, galleries overflowing with original art, bookstores galore, an abundance of antiques and collectables and many other boutique shopping experiences. Whilst in Castlemaine we visit the authentic goldfields villa Buda Historic Home and Gardens. The house was originally built by a retired Indian Army officer in 1857, and is a superb example of the Victorian-era colonial architecture. The house and magnificent gardens were extended in the 1890's by a Hungarian gold and silversmith, Ernest Leviny. They are now open for you to enjoy and provide an insight into the town's refined and gracious past. Wandering through the historic home you will be transported to another era. The Buda Giftshop stocks unique homewares and jewellery featuring original Leviny designs as well as craftwork produced locally. We will have time here for lunch before making our way back to Bendigo. For the remainder of the afternoon, we'll be entertained by more of the Easter program.

### DAY 4: (BD) BENDIGO EASTER FESTIVAL: Sunday 17 April 2022

Happy Easter everyone! This morning we have a slower start to our day to enjoy our goodies from the Easter Bunny and to relax over breakfast at Seasons Bistro. First up we take a visit to the Chinese Joss House Temple - the oldest Joss House still in use in the Bendigo area. Built in 1860 it fell into disrepair but was restored by the National Trust and reopened in 1972. The Joss House is made up of three buildings - a caretakers residence, temple to Guan Kung and an ancestral hall with alters to several other gods and brilliant banners. Constructed using local handmade bricks and painted red- symbolizing happiness, strength and vitality – the Bendigo Joss House Temple is a unique and significant part of Bendigo's cultural history. We have time to purchase an early lunch, maybe from The Rotary Art and Craft Markets before we position ourselves along the street to enjoy the Easter Gala Parade\*. Returning to our accommodation we have time to relax before dinner. This evening we are in for a treat heading out and immersing ourselves in the Torchlight Lantern procession and fireworks\* event – a highlight of the festival. Since first being introduced it has continued a long standing tradition of bringing fire brigades from far and wide to contribute to the festivities. The unique parade is made up of three distinct sections; fire brigades and emergency services, lanterns and the contingent from the Bendigo Chinese Association.

### DAY 5: (BLD) BENDIGO EASTER FESTIVAL: Monday 18 April 2022

We have a later start to the day after our evening last night spent enjoying the fireworks spectacular. First up today we visit the Golden Dragon Museum. It shares the story of the impact and contribution made by the Chinese people of Bendigo - from the gold rush of the 1850s to the present day. One permanent display is "Sun Loong" the longest Imperial dragon in the world and "Loong" the oldest Imperial dragon in the world. Along with the museum and its wonderful dragons, processional regalia and stunning textiles you can also visit the Yi Yuan Gardens (Garden of Joy). Based on the Imperial Palace in Beijing, the architecture and construction of the gardens is authentic in every way. There will be time to view the Buddhist Temple dedicated to Guan Yin the Goddess of Mercy and look through the Gift Shop for a memento of your visit. We leave the museum with a greater appreciation of how the Bendigo Chinese community has influenced the proud history of Bendigo. We make a short stop for morning tea at Lake Weeroona Park and it's then on to Bendigo Pottery for a self-guided tour of the Interpretative Museum. For over 150 years Bendigo Pottery has been famous for creating high quality ceramics. We'll step back in time and learn about the production processes, machinery, working conditions and traditional skills of Bendigo Pottery from its beginnings in 1858 to the current day. A major tourist attraction, Bendigo pottery offers visitors an extensive retail outlet, demonstrations of hand throwing by potters and hands on clay experiences and has one of the most significant collections of historic wood fired kilns in the world. Why not pick-up a little something from the extensive range of high quality tableware and cookware as we wander through the retail outlet. There will also be time to meander through the Antiques and Collectables Centre - with over 40 individual dealers this will be a trip down memory lane featuring both unique collectables and nostalgic items. This historic business will also be our destination for lunch today. After a delicious meal at Bendigo Pottery we make our way to the quirky and unusual "Confectionary Capers" where we are guaranteed a memorable and stimulating visit. Confectionary Capers is a mechanical extravaganza. Here you will be challenged to think laterally and creatively, celebrate the WHEEL as man's greatest invention or explore the quirky and fascinating nature of the English language - all in one unique location. We make the short drive back to our motel and settle in for our final evening meal sharing our stories of the fun filled time we've had Eggs-ploring Bendigo over the Easter Festival.

### DAY 6: (BL) HOME TO CANBERRA: Tuesday 19 April 2022

Sadly, today our tour comes to an end. Our day will be spent on the road. With stops on route, there will be time for morning tea and lunch at the iconic Kinross Woolshed Hotel where the building's origins date back to the early 1890's. We'll arrive home with new friendships made, having enjoyed our Easter break in Bendigo and surrounds.
