Day 1:(LD) CANBERRA TO MELBOURNE: Monday 27 March 2023

Welcome to our tour to Melbourne and surrounds featuring the Melbourne Flower Show. We meet our friendly Potter Travel crew and fellow travellers and begin our journey. Stopping in Albury for lunch, we continue across the Victorian border to the vibrant capital, Melbourne. This will be our home for the next seven nights, so unpack and relax before our welcome dinner in the hotel restaurant.

Day 2: (BLD) MELBOURNE: Tuesday 28 March 2023

Known as the sporting capital of Australia, there is no better place to start your Melbourne exploration than at the famous Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG). Located here is the National Sports Museum which presents world class exhibitions and sporing artefacts. Next, we head to the picturesque Royal Botanic Gardens for a guided tour. The impressive gardens features and amazing and diverse plant collection including camelias, rainforest flora, succulents and roses. We enjoy a delicious lunch onsite, taking in the stunning surroundings. Located on the southern banks of the Yarra River is Eureka Tower. Enjoy floor to ceiling, 360-degree views of Melbourne's CBD, sports precinct, Port Phillip Bay, Docklands and everything in between.

Day 3: (BLD) DANDENONG RANGES: Wednesday 29 March 2023

We travel to Belgrave to join the famous Puffing Billy Steam Train on a ride through to Lakeside. Journey through magnificent Dandenong Ranges, with lush fern gullies brushing past and Mountain Ash trees towering overhead onboard the open sided carriages. Nestled deep withing the serene landscape of the Dandenong Ranges is the gorgeous township, Sassafras. Discover the village's nineteenth century charm with niche stores lining the streets. Lunch is at Fortnums Restaurant, which has the bright airy look and feel of an English conservatory with a charming atmosphere and delicious food. We travel to Sky High on the uppermost reach of the Dandenong Ranges, to look at the big picture, from the Mornington Peninsula across the majestic sweep of Port Phillip Bay, surrounded by Melbourne's growing urban fringes, to the You Yangs on the southern horizons.

Day 4: (BD) MELBOURNE FLOWER SHOW: Thursday 30 March 2023

Today is festival day! We head to the International Flower and Garden Show. This hallmark event for Victoria is the most prestigious of its kind in Australia. Over 300 exhibits are on show representing horticulture, nurseries, landscape gardening, floristry and cut flowers together with their associated products and services. The show will simply take your breath away with their associated products and services. The show will simply take your breath away with the work of Australia's leading floral designers creating exquisite feature displays. We have plenty of time here before a visit to Ripponlea Estate. We are taken on a journey back in time with a unique glimpse into the lifestyles of the wealthiest Australians of the era. We explore the house and gardens of sweeping lawns, magnificent trees, a tranquil lake unique fernery and an orchard with over on hundred varieties of heritage apples and pears. Tonight, we make our way to New Quay Promenade in the Docklands for dinner at Berth Restaurant.

Day 5: (BLD) YARRA VALLEY: Friday 31 March 2023

We travel to Coombe – Melba Estate, one of the largest and oldest family estates in the Yarra Valley. The history, beauty and romance of the estate makes it a unique place to visit as we enjoy morning tea and a tour. Not too far away is Yarra Valley Chocolaterie and Ice Creamery. We'll be welcomed with chocolate tastings, displays of thousands of premium chocolates and chocolatiers hard at work handcrafting their creations. We have time to purchase some goodies if desired. This afternoon we visit Alowyn Gardens, which started life as a blackberry infested paddock. Now the gardens have been deigned with shade and comfort in mind and the purpose is to provide an informative and educational experience for those experience the beautiful gardens.

Day 6: (BLD) WERRIBEE: Saturday 1 April 2023

We make our way to Werribee Open Range Zoo, where it has a special focus on African animals. We board our special safari bus across the unique open range savanna and spot rhinos, giraffes and zebras. With free time to wander at leisure, visit the world's largest gorilla exhibit or see cheeky monkeys at play. We travel to nearby Werribee Park Mansion, long regarded as Victoria's finest rural colonial homestead. Explore the formal gardens, see a magnificent display of colour at the State Rose Garden and marvel at the expansive manicured landscape. We drive to Geelong where we board the Bellarine Express. Relax and enjoy the scenery as this state-of-the-art vessel will take us back into the heart of Melbourne, where our coach will pick us up and transfer us back to our hotel.

Day 7: (BLD) MORNINGTON PENINSULA: Sunday 2 April 2023

This morning we soar the heights of the Mornington Peninsula gliding quietly through the sky in a gondola at Arthurs Sea Eagle. With uninterpreted views across Port Phillip Bay and framed by swaying gum trees, we'll be immersed by the magic landscape. Later, we uncover Australia's oldest and most famous hedge maze at Ashcombe Maze and Lavender Gardens. We have time to wander the year-round flowering lavender labyrinth and 25 acres of world acclaimed gardens. Overlooking the vineyard and sculpture park to the Western Port Bay and Phillip Island, we enjoy lunch with a view at the Pt Leo Estate Restaurant. Relax with a glass of wine and indulge in the decadent food which celebrates the regions delicious produce. Our final stop is to the Tyabb Packing House Antiques Centre. It claims to house Australia's largest collection of antiques and collectables! There are over 30 dealers here specialising in antiques, deco, old wares, retro, vintage and speciality items – something for everyone!

Day 8: (BL) HOMEWARD BOUND: Monday 3 April 2023

With our bags packed, we have a day on the coach as we head back to Canberra. Stopping in Chiltern for lunch we continue home, arriving late afternoon from a fantastic holiday to Melbourne.
