CANBERRA TO LAUNCESTON

Day 1 - Wednesday 14 October 2026 (D)

Welcome to our fantastic tour to Tasmania. We board our flight and arrive in Launceston. On arrival we travel to **Cataract Gorge**, a magnificent reserve in the city centre. These gardens have evolved for over a century and are still one of the most popular places in the city to relax and enjoy nature. There are some pleasant walks through the landscaped gardens or for those interested, enjoy a ride on the chairlift which crosses the gorge. We check in to our hotel and enjoy our welcome dinner.

TAMAR VALLEY

Day 2 - Thursday 15 October 2026 (BLD)

We make our way to Beaconsfield, the site of Tasmania's largest discovery of gold, and of course more recently, the incredible rescue in 2006 of two miners trapped underground. We'll visit the **Beaconsfield Gold Mine and Heritage Museum**, home to Australia's only water wheel driven stamp battery and features an extensive collection of memorabilia and artefacts.

Seahorse World and **Platypus House** are two unique attractions that sit right next to each other so we plan to visit both this afternoon. Seahorse World is a working farm and the information we receive here show us just what fascinating creatures they truly are. Platypus are very shy and quite illusive in the wild but here we get a chance to see them face to face as they swim and go about their daily business. We return to Launceston after an enjoyable day.





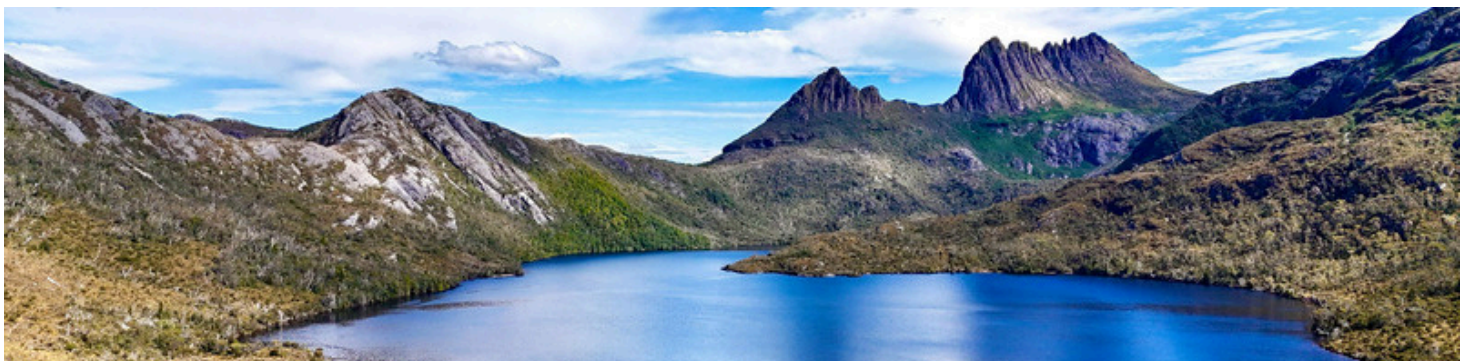
LAUNCESTON TO CRADLE MOUNTAIN

Day 3 - Friday 16th October 2026 (BLD)

Making your way through rural towns, stop at **Sheffield**, a colourful community with vibrant paintings across the town. Known as **Tasmania's Outdoor Art Gallery**, murals adorn buildings with stories of the history, people and events that happened in the region.

Continuing to Cradle Mountain, you'll enjoy lunch at the Cradle Mountain Hotel, with time to wander the impressive Wilderness Gallery, showcasing original sculptures, drawings, paintings and large installations throughout multiple display rooms. Then visit **Devil @ Cradle**, a conservation sanctuary for Tasmania's most iconic resident, the Tasmanian Devil. The visit should provide an understanding of their lifecycle and the current threats that confront them. We check in to our hotel where we'll feel right amongst the alpine wilderness.

CRADLE MOUNTAIN TO HOBART

Day 4 - Saturday 17 October 2026 (BD)

Discover the rugged mountains, ancient rainforests and stunning scenery of **Cradle Mountain, Lake St Clair National Park**. Take a short drive to **Waldheim Chalet**, the forest home of pioneer Gustav Weindorger and visit **Dove Lake**, a glacially carved lake directly beneath Cradle Mountain, offering iconic views. After an incredible morning, we travel to Hobart where we can unpack and relax as this will be our home for the next three night. Tonight we dine at the amazing **Point Revolving Restaurant**, seventeen floors above the River Derwent.

HOBART & SURROUNDS

Day 5 - Sunday 18 October 2026 (BD)

Set between the towering peak of mount Wellington and the Derwent River, Hobart is one of the most beautiful cities in the world and this morning you take a sightseeing tour around town from the coach. Next, visit the **World Heritage listed Cascades Female Factory**, that tells the story of the displacement, mistreatment and forced migration of convict women and girls. From 1828 to 1856 approximately 7,000 convict women spent time at the Cascades Female Factory, each with their own story to tell. On the Convict Women's Tour, our guide will provide insights of the site, the convict system of punishment and reform and offer a glimpse of what convict life was like for thousands of women transported to Van Diemen's Land.

Spend the remainder of the afternoon in the historic town of **Richmond**. Its streets are paved with history and many of the fine colonial buildings have been adapted for use as art galleries, craft shops and restaurants. The convict-built Richmond Bridge over the Coal River is the oldest bridge in Australia. Late afternoon we return to Hobart.





PORT ARTHUR

Day 6 - Monday 19 October 2026 (BLD)

Today discover the unimaginable story of the **UNESCO World Heritage Listed Port Arthur Historic Site**. Once one of the British Empire's most notorious penal settlements, Port Arthur holds a powerful place in Australia's convict history, where thousands of prisoners endured harsh conditions, hard labour and a life of isolation. Begin your visit at the Visitor Centre before joining an informative guided walking tour, bringing to life the compelling stories, historic ruins and preserved buildings of this fascinating colony.

Leaving Port Arthur, continue your journey along the spectacular Tasman Peninsula, renowned for its dramatic coastal scenery and towering sea cliffs. Stop to admire the remarkable natural rock formations of **Tasman Arch**, a stunning natural bridge carved by the powerful Southern Ocean, and nearby **Devils Kitchen**, where relentless waves have sculpted deep cliffs and chasms over thousands of years. These breathtaking geological wonders provide the perfect finale to a day rich in history, scenery and discovery before returning to Hobart.



HOMeward BOUND

Day 7 - Tuesday 20th October 2026 (BLD)

Today marks the conclusion of our Tasmania Highlights adventure. We transfer to the airport for our flight home, taking with us cherished memories of rugged coastlines, historic towns and the warm hospitality of Tasmania.

Payments: A non-refundable, non-transferable deposit is required within 7 days of receiving written confirmation of your booking. Potter Travel may cancel the booking if this deposit is not received within that time. **The deposit for this tour is \$700 per person.** The final payment is due by **Friday 7th August 2026.**

Online Direct Debit transactions must include your Booking Reference noted on your Booking Confirmation. There is a 1.99% service fee on all credit/debit card transactions, this covers the cost of using Stripe's reliable payment processing services. The charges will apply for partial or full payments by credit card and debit card. *Subject to change, in accordance with Stripe Gateway payment conditions.

Cancellation: You may cancel your booking by giving written notice to Potter Travel or calling our reservation team. Cancellation fees and charges will be levied as follows, irrespective of when notice of cancellation is received:

- Any amounts we have paid or have contractually committed to pay to third parties to deliver your travel arrangements that we cannot reasonably recover (for example payments made or due to hotels, airlines, cruise companies, tour wholesalers).
- Where we operate any of the services included in your travel arrangements (for example, coach travel), a reasonable amount attributable to such services which we determine we cannot resell.
- A fee which is the greater of the deposit and 20% of the booking value to compensate us for work performed up until the time of cancellation.
- A fee not greater than 5% of the booking value to compensate us for processing the cancellation and any associated refund.
- Cancellations received within 30 days before departure will incur a 100% cancellation fee.

We recommend that you obtain an appropriate level of travel insurance at the time you pay your deposit to cover any applicable non-refundable or cancellation fees.

Health and Fitness: Our tours are designed for active retirees and, whilst we have passengers every day with varied mobility levels, it is an essential requirement that each passenger be able to negotiate coach steps without the aid of the coach driver or other non-related passengers. No passenger will be permitted to continue the tour while their mental or physical condition is such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves. As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering safe and enjoyable travel experiences, we encourage passengers to ensure they are fit to undertake the activities and travel outlined in our tour itineraries.

It is important that all passengers are reasonably healthy and able to participate fully in our tours. Our tours are designed so that you, the passenger, in most cases, can be as active or inactive as you prefer. However, some tours do require a higher level of fitness and the ability to walk on uneven ground unassisted; the ability to walk upstairs or up hills may also be required to participate in the tour fully. There may be times when you will be standing for up to 30 minutes during a tour of an attraction. You may have to walk over uneven ground with no paving. You should be able to get in and out of transportation, including but not limited to Potter Travel coaches, unassisted and be able to manage your own luggage where necessary, i.e. at airports.

Passengers must advise Potter Travel of pre-existing medical conditions at the time of booking that may affect their ability/mobility/health, or well-being whilst on tour. Passengers must provide Us with emergency contact information for a third party before embarking on a tour.
