Day 1: (L): CANBERRA TO MULWALA: Monday 20 May 2024

Welcome aboard our 5 day tour to the twin towns of Yarrowonga-Mulwala. Beyond Wagga Wagga is Lockhart where we'll stop for lunch then visit the Greens Gonyah Museum and the Doris Golder Gallery. The portraits in her collection were created using washed wool from white and coloured sheep, no dyes were used. Doris completed around 30 rare pieces of art over 14 years, some of which were even displayed at Parliament House. Later we arrive into Mulwala and check into our accommodation for the next 4 nights. Dinner tonight is by your own arrangement and expense and available at the Club at a time that suits you.

Day 2: (BL): EXPLORING THE LOCAL AREA: Tuesday 21 May 2024

Refreshed after a good night's sleep, our day begins with a cruise on the quiet waters of Lake Mulwala. Boarding the 'MV Paradise Queen' enjoy full commentary on this Paddleboat as we drift by the lake's towering River Red Gums and sandy beaches. With morning tea on board it's the perfect way to start the day! Back on dry land we cross the river and head for Corowa. Our lunch venue, named Bonnie was inspired by the Scottish heritage of the All Saints Estate. Presented with a beautiful platter of local produce sit and enjoy this gorgeous setting. Take a stroll around the duck pond and uncover more of the grand surroundings of the original castle and grounds on our garden history tour. There's no hurry as we now return to Mulwala. Dinner tonight is by your own arrangement and expense and available at the Club at a time that suits you.

Day 3: (BL): LOCAL PRODUCE: Wednesday 22 May 2024

Our day has us exploring the local sights starting with the Big Strawberry. We take a tour through the facility highlighting the production area and their recent expansion into avocados. Following a morning tea we continue to nearby Aintree Farm Organics. Mariea and Trinity established their 'Farmacy' in the 1980s and together they produce and offer an extensive range of all Australian honey varieties including almond honey, hemp oil, almond products and much more. Our lunch venue is the charming Byramine Homestead. Built by the famous explorer Hamilton Hume for his sister-in-law, Elizabeth Hume, the homestead was classified by the National Trust due to its unique design, featuring octagonal rooms. The central room, known as the fortress room allowed a clear



view from all angles in case of attack from bushrangers. Take a stroll around the well-established garden and view the Elm trees, the oldest in Victoria and sample one of the beers produced at the on-site brewery. Certainly a day of local produce. Dinner tonight is by your own arrangement and expense and available at the Club at a time that suits you.

Day 4: (BL): MECHANICAL & CACTI EVOLUTION: Thursday 23 May 2024

Arriving at the Museum of Vehicle Evolution (MOVE) this morning, we trace the history of motoring with examples of classic, heritage and muscle cars, including motorcycles and vintage bicycles. The museum also boasts a wide range of petrol memorabilia, a costume collection and the Clayton gramophone, telephone and radio collection. Heading across to the small town of Tungamah, spot the silo featuring much loved Australian wildlife including the pink and grey Galah and sulphur crested Cockatoo. Our lunch venue is at the Tungamah Hotel before visiting our last stop for the day. The amazing Cactus Country houses cacti from all over the world and our hosts will explain how this came to be as we wander through the impressive displays. Dinner tonight is by your own arrangement and expense and available at the Club at a time that suits you.

Day 5: (BL): MULWALA TO CANBERRA: Friday 24 May 2024

Bidding farewell to Mulwala, we follow the Murray River almost to our morning destination of Jindera. Having some time to visit the Pioneer Museum and Wagners Store, learn how the first German settlers arrived in the area having trekked from Adelaide in horse drawn wagons. The museum's own building is a small wattle and daub hut they built, just off the main track through town, possibly making it the oldest remaining cottage or house in the Albury District. Onwards to Holbrook for lunch with our final leg taking us back to Canberra. Arriving home safe and sound, we farewell our fellow travellers with fond memories of a wonderful tour.
