DAY 1: (D) CANBERRA TO NORFOLK ISLAND: Wednesday 5 March 2025

This morning we meet at Canberra Airport for our flight to Norfolk Island via Sydney (flight details to be advised). Upon arrival we are met by **Baunti Tours** and transferred to our accommodation at **The South Pacific Resort**. Set in subtropical gardens with mountain and valley views, the South Pacific Resort is centrally located in the township of Burnt Pine. Settle in, then have the remainder of the afternoon to relax or to take a look around. Dinner tonight is at the resort.

DAY 2: (BLD): NORFOLK ISLAND—FOUNDATION DAY: Thursday 6 March 2025

On 6 March locals gather at **Emily Bay** in Historic Kingston to commemorate **Foundation Day**, the arrival of the British First Fleeters under the command of Lt. Philip Gidley King on Norfolk Island on 6 March 1788. This was the very first European settlement here on Norfolk Island. Captain James Cook had landed here in October 1774 and the British had instructed the Australian First Fleeters to also sail to Norfolk Island to set up a British Colony on the remote South Pacific Island. This morning you will be transferred to the World Heritage listed convict Kingston area. Here you will see the re-enactment of the landing of the first Convicts arriving on Norfolk Island. A buffet lunch will be served at **Emily Bay**. Complimentary champagne and orange juice will be served. Later this afternoon we return to the resort where we can relax before dinner.

DAY 3: (BD): NORFOLK ISLAND: Friday 7 March 2025

This morning we start the day with the **Breakfast Bushwalk** (which caters to all levels of walking-or, alternatively, we can arrange for you to be collected). The Breakfast Bushwalk is a relaxed amble through the national park with a local guide—a BBQ breakfast and ocean view await us at the end. We then enjoy the Discover Our World Tour, a must for every visitor! Baunti Tours will introduce you to the beauty and diversity of their island paradise. We tour the island with an informative local guide to set the scene for your stay. This afternoon enjoy the Taste of Norfolk and meet some passionate local producers. Visit a bee-keepers home to view flow hives, learn about the fascinating local honeybees, view their incredible flight path to their hives and taste the local honey. Have a look at the beginning of our local tea industry, Norfolk Tea, and enjoy tasting a beautiful blend of teas including Iced Berry and Masala Chai. Visit another host who is making local salt from the oceans that surround the island. You will taste of our local beef and the salt they are producing for cooking and table. Then moving on to meet another Norfolk Islander where you'll view a cooking demonstration. You will see and hear about our traditional dishes that were handed down by our Tahitian foremothers. Watch us create green banana fritters flavoured with local honey or a similar dish depending on the seasons. Tonight we head out to enjoy a **Progressive Dinner** which is the perfect way to get a taste of the real Norfolk lifestyle. We travel to some lovely local homes on the island. All you have to do is relax and enjoy the home-cooked food, bursting with the goodness of fresh island produce. Chat with your fellow diners and soak up the stories of your island hosts. They'll share their passion for their little island paradise. A complimentary glass of white wine accompanies the main course, tea and coffee served with dessert. You are welcome to BYO if you wish. After dinner we return to the resort.

DAY 4: (BD): NORFOLK ISLAND: Saturday 8 March 2025

This morning we enjoy a **Glass Bottom Boat** adventure that will take you out on the lagoon of Emily and Slaughter Bays. Norfolk Island has the second southernmost coral reef in the world and attracts a diversity of marine life. View beautiful coral gardens as you cruise the crystal-clear pristine waters of the lagoon. There's also a wide variety of species of colourful fish on display. Lunch is at your own expense, and the afternoon is at your leisure. Late afternoon we head out to an **Island Fish Fry** for dinner. A place for 'angels and eagles' was La Perouse's description of Norfolk Island when he failed to find a suitable landing place back in the eighteenth century. Perched on the clifftop on a beautiful private property close to Puppy's Point, you will have spectacular valley views and the magnificent spread of ocean stretching to the far horizon. The beautifully set tables will delight you – it's the most glamorous picnic you will ever attend! And then the food! Scrumptiously fresh, local fish is prepared the local way in golden beer batter and accompanied with a range of seasonal island dishes including those passed down from the Polynesian foremothers. See how the locals make the most of their home grown produce and enjoy paddock to plate freshness. This extends even to dessert which is Norfolk Island pies made from local eggs and fruit in season. A cash bar offers wine, beer and juice, so you don't even have to worry about bringing your own. The feast kicks off with an entertainer and a very talented group of Tahitian-style dancers, silhouetted against the setting sun. And even when the sunset fails to dazzle, the singing and dancing will definitely set the tone for an evening of fun and relaxation. After a great evening we return to the resort.

Optional Tour—Please confirm at time of booking if you would like to book this tour at additional cost—Lantern Lit Ghost Tour. A lantern-lit tour through the historic streets of Norfolk's World Heritage Listed Area where the macabre and spinetingling tales of murders, suicides and hangings come to life. Learn the bizarre and turbulent stories of our dark past as you are led by your local ghost host through the Olde Town.

DAY 5: (BD): NORFOLK ISLAND: Sunday 9 March 2025

This morning we have organised a transfer to and from the **Island Markets**, for those interested in having a look. The remainder of the morning is free to relax or do some personal **sight seeing**. This afternoon Baunti Tours take us on their **Convict Kingston Tour**. Learn about World Heritage Listed Kingston. Hear about the first settlers, the Polynesians who came 900 years ago. Learn about the First and Second Convict Settlements and the facts and legends associated with each. Learn how Norfolk became home to descendants of the infamous 'Bounty' mutiny. After our tour we return to the resort to relax before dinner out this evening. Tonight enjoy the **Who Killed The Surveyor** dinner, a murder mystery dinner set in 1859 on Norfolk Island. Go back in time and dine with the Chief Magistrate Frederick Young and his wife Mary. Frederick is hosting this dinner to honour His Excellency, Governor General Denison who is making yet another visit to the island. A young English surveyor from Sydney is found washed up on the cove southeast of Point Hunter. Dine on a 3-course dinner while you help solve the mystery of 'Who Killed the Surveyor?' The tour takes place in one of the original, elegantly restored Georgian houses at No. 9 Quality Row, on the beautiful Kingston foreshores.

DAY 6: (BD): NORFOLK ISLAND: Monday 10 March 2025

This morning we visit **Cyclorama**. Here we walk inside a continuous 360 degree panoramic painting and feel as though we are standing on a pier or a ships' deck. A spectacular 3D effect is achieved with realistic perspective and detailed artwork stretching all the way to the visitor's feet. Storyboards, lists and maps explain the history in an easy to understand way. While we are here we enjoy a **Morning Tea at Hilli's**. This afternoon we enjoy the **Norfolk Island Culture Tour** an immersion in Norfolk Island's rich cultural heritage. You will be welcomed to an Island home steeped in history and gratitude for our forebears, see artefacts passed down through the generations, listen and learn about our local language, fishing, cooking and weaving. You will get to sample some of our traditional seasonal dishes and try your hand at weaving. This tour is one not to be missed! The remainder of the afternoon is at your leisure. You'll hear about the challenges of importing bare rooted plants into the island. Enjoy an easy walk around the farm with the owners. Learn about the 15 different lavender varieties that have been planted. View their other commercial plantings of Sage, Rosemary, Rose Geranium, Sunflowers and other vegetables that are grown on Fitzy's Farm for use in our 'paddock to plate' farm experience. After the tour, head back to the farm building for one of the farm's home grown baked potatoes or sweet potatoes, with your choice of toppings. Also included is a beer or wine from the bar. Gift shop available for purchasing their locally made products after the tour. The Bounty Show and Dinner is a world famous story. On this tour it will be told by a cast of actors hosted at a theatre restaurant. Come and join us for a night on the Bounty. Let us take you on a journey from England to Tahiti. This fun, factual and interactive dinner show will tell the story of life that led to the Mutiny on The Bounty, join us for a night of feasting, frivolity and lots of laughs. The cast of the amazing feature show will have you enthralled as we all sail with Captain Bligh and the Mutineers from the famous Bounty. Includes 3 course dinner. Return to the resort for your last night's accommodation.
