CANBERRA TO ROCKHAMPTON Day 1 - Friday 25 July 2025 (D)

We head out of town for a geological delight. Feel the excitement of venturing into an ancient coral reef cave as we head into the **Capricorn Caves**. Be guided through the easily accessible **Cathedral Cave.** Travelling to **Yeppoon**, we are in for a treat as we arrive at **Footlights Theatre Restaurant**. We not only enjoy a delicious meal but will also be entertained by their comedy show, giving us an evening of fun and laughter!











TOUR OVERVIEW

GEMS & HERITAGE MUSEUM Day 4 - Monday 28 July 2025 (BLD)

Today we head out to **Mount Hay Gemstone Tourist Park** which is known for thunderegg fossicking. Next, we take a trip out to **Mount Morgan** where lunch will be. Then it's a visit to the **Mount Morgan Historical Museum** which delves into the captivating history of the region. Among the extensive range, includes mining equipment, historic household objects and an extensive photograph display. Throughout our interesting visit we will be taken through the years of Mount Morgan life and be presented with the faces and stories of some of the towns most prominent figures.

GREAT KEPPEL ISLAND Day 5 - Tuesday 29 July 2025 (BLD)

Our cruise will take us to the **spectacular Great Keppel Island**, located at the Southern Great Barrier Reef, near the Tropic of Capricorn. After morning tea upon arrival to the island, we depart on a glass bottom boat for a coral viewing cruise. We finish the day exploring the island village, browsing for souvenirs or simply replacing on the white beach before returning to Rockhampton.

CATTLE YARDS & HISTORIC VILLAGES Day 6 - Wednesday 30 July 2025 (BLD)

The cattle industry dominates this part of Queensland so it's appropriate we spend some time exploring the local Saleyards. Take in the dust and drama of the **Central Queensland Livestock Exchange**. Formally known as the "Gracemere Saleyards", it commenced operation in 1953 and now ranks as one of the major selling centres in Australia. Watch farmers and cattle grazers as they big to stock up at the live auctions. Returning to Rockhampton we visit the award-winning **Heritage Village**. There are unique original buildings, homesteads and businesses from the 100-year period between 1850 and 1950.
