Day 4 - Friday 26th February 2027 (BD)

Once considered a sleepy city, Adelaide has undergone a rapid transformation with world-class art, music and sporting facilities to explore. We meet our **local guide** for a tour and for an excellent overview of the city and its parklands. Making a stop at Montefiore Hill, it was from this spot that Colonel Light planned a great city of the future in the sweeping valley below. Then we discover the elegance

For more than 150 years, the **Adelaide Central Market** has been the place to pick up fresh ingredients, meet the producers and gather at the popular eateries. Undergoing an extensive renovation, it is one of Adelaide's premier food destinations for multicultural cuisine and fresh produce. Dinner tonight is at the Hotel.



ADELAIDE TO MONARTO

Day 5 - Saturday 27th February 2027 (BD)

We make our way to Hahndorf, located in the Adelaide Hills. The town is a superb "flashback" to the nineteenth century with its shops, eateries and attractions housed in authentic surroundings. First, we visit The Cedars. Lovers of fine art and charming gardens will enjoy this superb country property known as the home to iconic landscape painter and early conservationist, Sir Hans Heysen. The Cedars have been identified as the Nation's oldest surviving purpose-built artist studio (1912) while the homestead has a grace and charm that speaks of the style of a bygone era. Be captivated by the original works displayed in the furnished home. Nearby we discover Beerenberg Strawberry Farm where we are introduced to the sixth-generation farm that specialises in chutneys, jams, sauces and gourmet relishes.



We enjoy time at leisure in the main street of Hahndorf before travelling to Monarto where our accommodation is in the wilderness at Monarto Zoo's Safari Resort.



ADELAIDE TO MONARTO continued

Day 5 - Saturday 27th February 2027 (BD)

This one-of-a-kind experience as our retreat is where luxury meets adventure with our hotel, built in an area known as Wild Africa, blends seamlessly with a gourmet restaurant, bar overlooking the waterhole, two refreshing pools and beautifully appointed rooms. With over 50 species of native and African animals, the park plays a major role, nationally and internationally, in breeding programs for rare and endangered species. After time for lunch, we're in for a real treat when we embark on The Lions 360 Experience. It's Australia's only 360-degree lion encounter which gives you a prey's eye view into the world of these incredible predators. Walking through the tunnel, we'll emerge within clawing range of one of Australia's largest lion prides. The safe but adventurous encounter will leave us amazed.





HOMeward BOUND

Day 7 - Monday 1st March 2027 (BL)

What a great time we've had exploring Adelaide and surrounds! We have an afternoon flight, so we make the most of our final day. Our first visit is a behind-the-scenes tour of Jurlique Farm, a biodynamic farm cultivating botanicals for its natural skincare, learning about the brand's history, plant propagation, biodynamic principles, and the skincare benefits of various botanicals. From here we travel to the internationally renowned wine region of McLaren Vale where we find Wirra Wirra Vineyards, where the imposing ironstone buildings offer a warm welcome. We enjoy a 'feed me' style lunch to which is bound to be a scrumptious way to finish our tour. We make our way to Adelaide Airport for our flight to Canberra, arriving home from a fantastic tour.

What animals will I be able to see from the Resort?

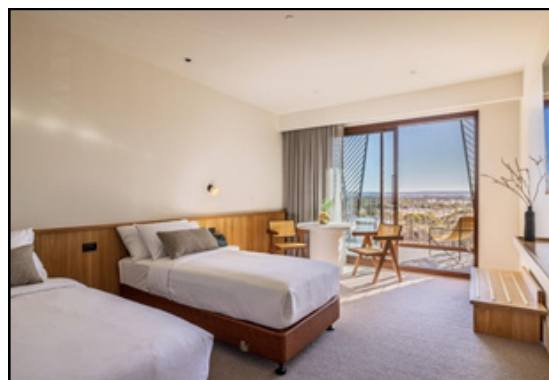
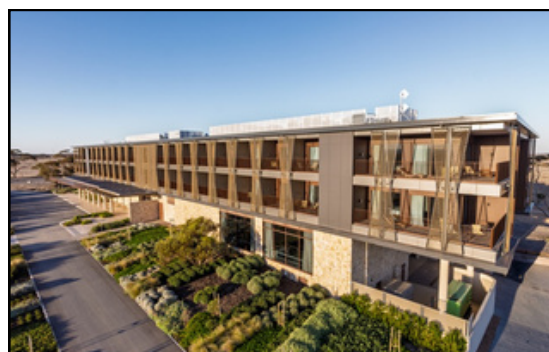
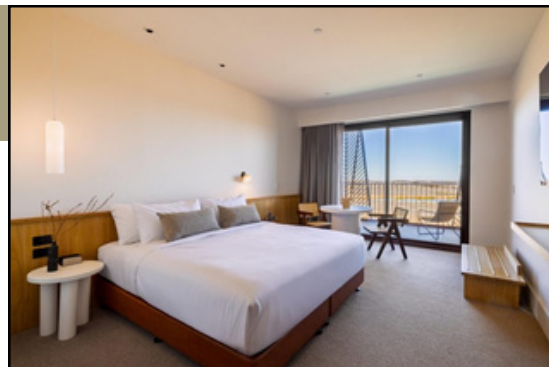
The waterhole is located incredibly close to the Resort, offering spectacular views of the wild animals as they come in to drink. Animals in this area include giraffe, zebra, eland, ostrich, nyala, oryx, blackbuck and barbary rams.

What accessibility facilities are available at Monarto Safari Resort?

- **Wheelchair-accessible rooms:** The Resort has specially designed rooms equipped with accessible features such as wider doorways, grab bars, and lowered fixtures for ease of use. Please let us know at the time of booking if an accessible room is required.
- **Accessible tours:** The vehicles used for Wildlife Safari experiences can accommodate guests with mobility needs. Our staff will assist as necessary to ensure a smooth and enjoyable experience.
- **Accessible pool:** All-ages pool features a ramp into the shallow end.

What are the Rooms like?

We have booked Waterhole Rooms which boast a stunning view directly into Wild Africa, so you can spend your afternoon spotting some amazing animals from your private balcony as they congregate around the neighbouring waterhole



 Activity Level: Moderate (Level 2)

This 7-day tour combines three long coach travel days (5–6 hours, with regular stops) with light to moderate walking of 1–3 km on touring days. Some venues include gravel garden paths and uneven farm surfaces (The Cedars, Beerenberg, Jurlique). The return flight requires guests to walk through airport terminals and manage their own luggage. Enclosed, supportive footwear is recommended. Guests using a walking aid can participate in most activities; please contact us to discuss the airport transfer and farm visits before booking.

Potter Travel may cancel the booking if this deposit is not received within that time. **The deposit for this tour is \$500 per person.** The final payment is due by **Wednesday, 25th November 2026.**

Online Direct Debit transactions must include your Booking Reference noted on your Booking Confirmation. There is a 1.99% service fee on all credit/debit card transactions, this covers the cost of using Stripe's reliable payment processing services. The charges will apply for partial or full payments by credit card and debit card. *Subject to change, in accordance with Stripe Gateway payment conditions.

Cancellation: You may cancel your booking by giving written notice to Potter Travel or calling our reservation team. Cancellation fees and charges will be levied as follows, irrespective of when notice of cancellation is received:

- Any amounts we have paid or have contractually committed to pay to third parties to deliver your travel arrangements that we cannot reasonably recover (for example payments made or due to hotels, airlines, cruise companies, tour wholesalers).
- Where we operate any of the services included in your travel arrangements (for example, coach travel), a reasonable amount attributable to such services which we determine we cannot resell.
- A fee which is the greater of the deposit and 20% of the booking value to compensate us for work performed up until the time of cancellation.
- A fee not greater than 5% of the booking value to compensate us for processing the cancellation and any associated refund.
- Deposit payment is non-refundable and non-transferable
- Cancellations received within 90 days before departure will incur a 25% cancellation fee.
- Cancellations received within 60 days before departure will incur a 50% cancellation fee.
- Cancellations received within 30 days before departure will incur a 100% cancellation fee.

We recommend that you obtain an appropriate level of travel insurance at the time you pay your deposit to cover any applicable non-refundable or cancellation fees.

As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering safe and enjoyable travel experiences, we encourage passengers to ensure they are fit to undertake the activities and travel outlined in our tour itineraries.

It is important that all passengers are reasonably healthy and able to participate fully in our tours. Our tours are designed so that you, the passenger, in most cases, can be as active or inactive as you prefer. However, some tours do require a higher level of fitness and the ability to walk on uneven ground unassisted; the ability to walk upstairs or up hills may also be required to participate in the tour fully.
