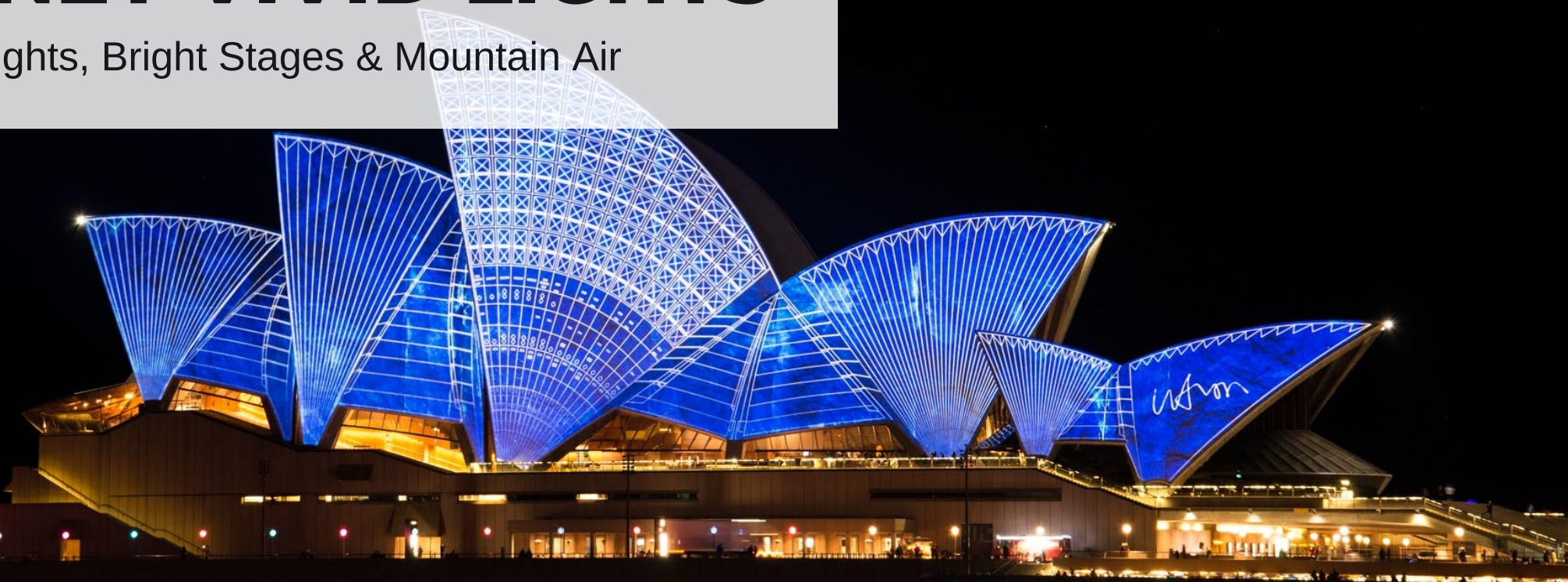

Watch Sydney Harbour turn to colour from the deck of a glass-window vessel and the comfort of a Hotel Lounge

Vivid Sydney is the largest festival of light, music and ideas in the Southern Hemisphere, and for three weeks each winter the harbour becomes a canvas. We have built this tour around the best seat in the house: a three-hour dinner cruise aboard Sydney's premier luxury glass boat, where unobstructed windows put the whole spectacle within arm's reach and dinner arrives with matched wines as the city glows around you.

There is a matinee, too. We have reserved seats at the Sydney Lyric theatre for Moulin Rouge – The Musical*, Step into the spectacular world of Baz Luhrmann's iconic film, reimagined for the stage. The perfect Wednesday afternoon before the harbour lights up.

Our home for three nights sits right on Darling Harbour, so the lights are on your doorstep every evening and never more than a short stroll away. By day we go looking for a different kind of Sydney: a walled Chinese garden hidden in the middle of the city, the orchards and cider sheds of Bilpin, a cool-climate garden a thousand metres up where the rare camellias save their finest flowering for winter, and on our last morning a train ride along the top of the Illawarra escarpment with the ocean far below.

Deliberately timed for midweek and home before the June long weekend — this is Vivid without the crowds.

THE BOOKLOVERS TRAIL —GOULBURN, BERRIMA & INTO SYDNEY

DAY 1 | Tuesday 8 June 2027 (LD)

Welcome aboard! Today is one for the readers among us. We leave Canberra behind and head north up the Federal Highway to Goulburn, where morning tea is waiting at The Roses Cafe, indoors and out of the winter air. Then there is time to wander Auburn Street and lose yourself in Argyle Books, the first stop on today's booklovers trail.

Late morning we reach Berrima and the second half of the trail, the Book Barn at Bendooley Estate. It is a heritage barn on a vineyard that also happens to be a working secondhand bookshop, shelves to the rafters and a fire going, and we have time to browse before we sit down to eat lunch among them. Two bookshops, one long lunch, and not a single thing to hurry for.

From Berrima it is a straight run into Sydney, where we check in to our home for the next three nights on the edge of Darling Harbour. We dine together at the hotel this evening, and for anyone with energy to spare, our tour leader will lead a gentle stroll across the footbridge for a first look at the Vivid lights or enjoy the amenities of the Club Lounge Twilight Drinks and Canapés with Harbour Views.

A MATINEE, THEN THE HARBOUR ALIGHT

DAY 2 | Wednesday 9 June 2027 (BD)

We begin gently, with a drive out along the harbour through Double Bay and Rose Bay to Vaucluse House, a grand 19th-century estate above the water, and the first house in Australia ever opened as a museum. Morning tea is served in the Tearooms on the estate before our guide takes us through the Wentworth family home, its original furnishings, servants' quarters and old kitchen wing. It is all indoors and thoroughly warm, which in June is no small thing. Afterwards we make our way to the Sydney Lyric Theatre for lunch at leisure (own expense) inside the Star City complex. Then our seats await us in the stalls for the matinee of Moulin Rouge! The Musical. A thoroughly good way to spend a winter afternoon. Afterwards we return to the hotel to freshen up, because this evening is the reason we came.

At dusk we board the Clearview Glass Boat, Sydney's premier luxury glassboat, for a dinner cruise with uninterrupted views in every direction. A premium modern Australian menu arrives with matched wines, and because it is Vivid, we are given a complimentary extra hour on the water — three hours in all to watch the Opera House sails, the Harbour Bridge and the whole foreshore turn to light. This is the night our passengers talk about long afterwards.



APPLE COUNTRY & A GARDEN IN THE CLOUDS

DAY 3 | Thursday 10 June 2027 (BLD)

Today we head west through the Hawkesbury and climb Bells Line of Road, one of the loveliest drives in the state. We pause at Bellbird Hill for the long view back across the plains to Sydney, then pull in at Bilpin — apple country — for a seated cider tasting at the Hillbilly Cider Shed, with apple pie beside the fire and perhaps something to take home. Climbing higher, we reach the Blue Mountains Botanic Garden Mount Tomah, the only botanic garden in Australia ringed by World Heritage wilderness.

Lunch is served indoors with the mountains spread out below us, and afterwards there is time in the garden itself — the new forest boardwalk, and Camellia Mountain, a Japanese-inspired garden of rare camellias that saves its finest flowering for winter. We are back at the hotel in good time to rest before dinner, and the Vivid lights are outside to enjoy.





THE GRAND PACIFIC DRIVE & A ROCK'N'ROLL FAREWELL

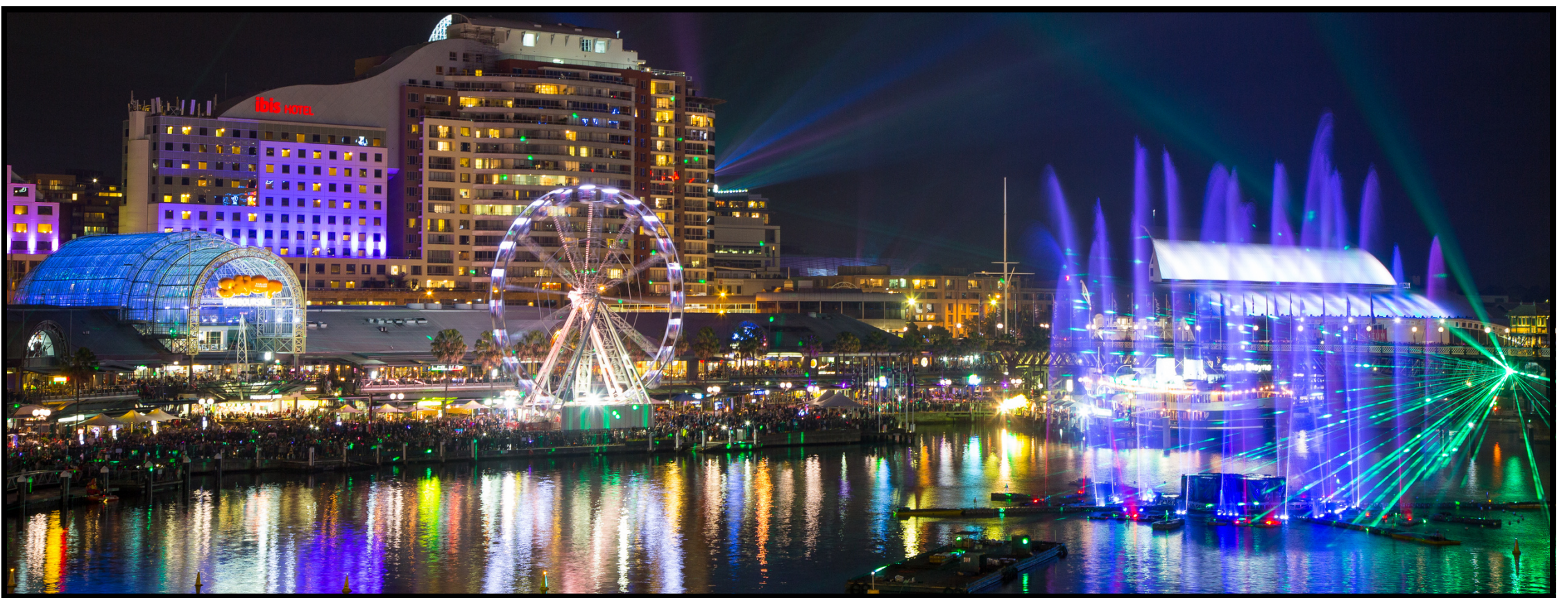
DAY 4 | Friday 11 June 2027 (BL)

We save one of the great Australian coastal drives for last. Heading south out of Sydney, we stop at Bald Hill above Stanwell Tops, where the whole Illawarra coast unfolds below you, and the hang gliders launch off the headland beside the car park. Then we drop down to the water and cross the Sea Cliff Bridge, 665 metres of roadway cantilevered off the cliff face and out over the ocean, before threading through the old coastal villages of Clifton, Scarborough, Coledale and Austinmer.

We turn and cross that remarkable bridge a second time — the view north is quite different- then climb back up to Panorama House at Maddens Plains, perched on the escarpment with the entire coastline laid out below the windows. Lunch here is a long and generous one: freshly baked bread, a two-course meal, and beer, wine and refreshments included throughout. And then the lights go down for a 45-minute Elvis show, because after three nights of Vivid, the only proper way to finish is with the King himself.

From the door it is a straight run west to the Hume and home, arriving in Canberra late afternoon with three good nights of Vivid behind us and, in all likelihood, a few songs still stuck in your head.

Meals are shown as B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner.- Itineraries subject to change

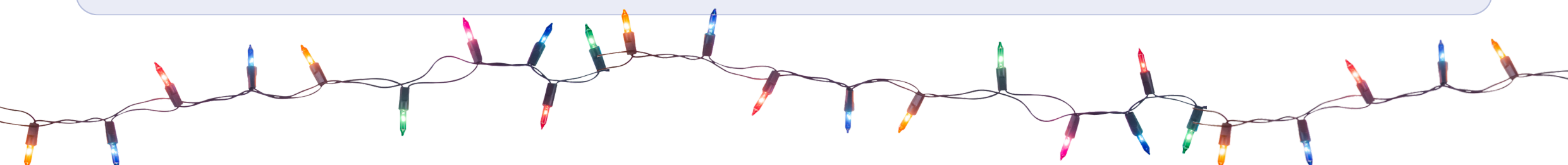


Activity Level: Easy to Moderate (Level 2)

This four-day tour is built around comfortable coach travel with short, mostly flat walking at each stop. Sydney is cold in June, and Day 3 climbs to around 1,000 metres at Mount Tomah where it may be 4–12°C with wind and cloud — warm waterproof layers, gloves and enclosed, flat, non-slip footwear are essential.

Five points deserve a mention. Day 4 is deliberately gentle — the Bald Hill view is from the car park and the coastal drive is enjoyed from your seat. Mount Tomah (Day 3) sits on a steep hillside, so we keep to the upper terraces and the forest boardwalk, and complimentary mobility scooters are available at the visitor centre for anyone who would like one. The Clearview Glass Boat (Day 2) involves steps to board from an exposed wharf after dark, and the wharf is cold and busy at that hour. The Sydney Lyric (Day 2) seats us in the stalls, so there are no stairs up to a circle — but please tell us at the time of booking if you need an aisle seat. The theatre also applies a bag size limit, and Moulin Rouge uses strobe lighting, fog, loud bangs and pyrotechnics.

Vaucluse House is a 19th-century home, so please expect some uneven floors and a step or two between rooms. Guests who use a walking aid can take part in every activity on this tour.

Health and Fitness: Our tours are designed for active retirees and, whilst we have passengers every day with varied mobility levels, it is an essential requirement that each passenger be able to negotiate coach steps without the aid of the coach driver or other non-related passengers. No passenger will be permitted to continue the tour while their mental or physical condition is such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves. As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering safe and enjoyable travel experiences, we encourage passengers to ensure they are fit to undertake the activities and travel outlined in our tour itineraries.

It is important that all passengers are reasonably healthy and able to participate fully in our tours. Our tours are designed so that you, the passenger, in most cases, can be as active or inactive as you prefer.
