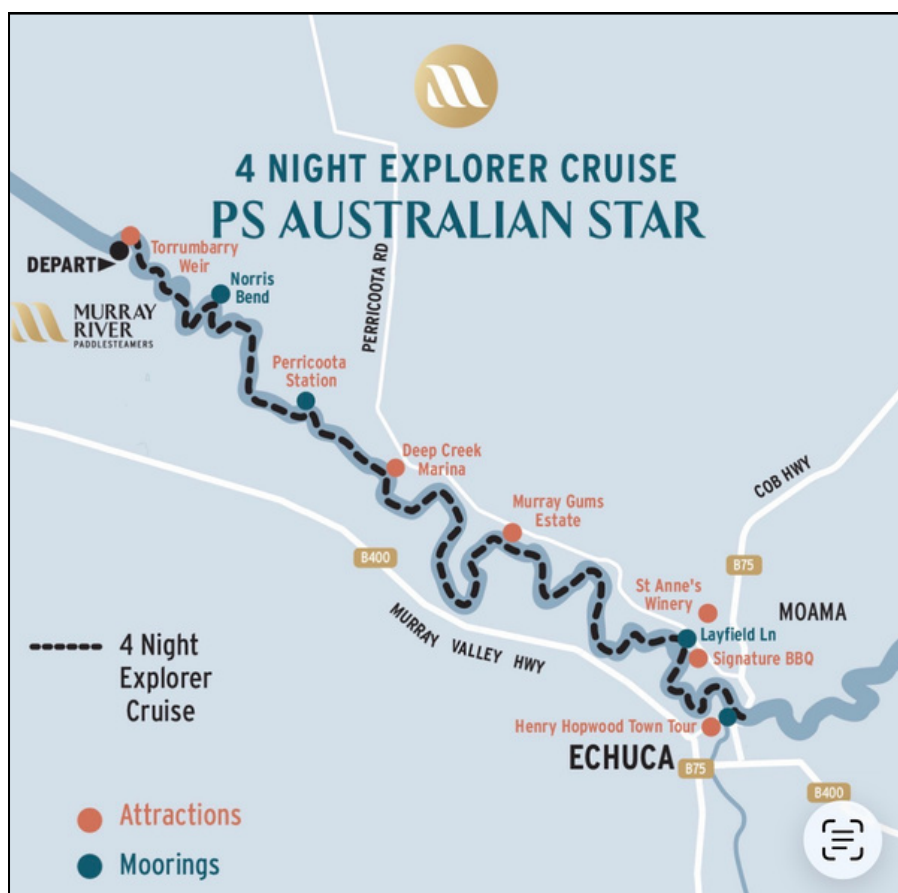

For solo guests, we offer a Sole Occupancy Land / Twin Share Cruise package: a private hotel room for all land-based touring nights, paired with a Twin Share rate cabin aboard PS Australian Star. The cost for the Sole/Twin combination is **\$8,590 per person**.

Conditions apply:

These conditions are in addition to Potter Travel's standard cancellation fees:

- If one guest in a twin-share cabin cancels prior to the final payment date, their deposit is non-refundable and will be applied towards the remaining guest's sole occupancy fare. The remaining guest's fare will revert to the sole occupancy rate.

DAY 2 | Monday 30 August 2027 (BD)

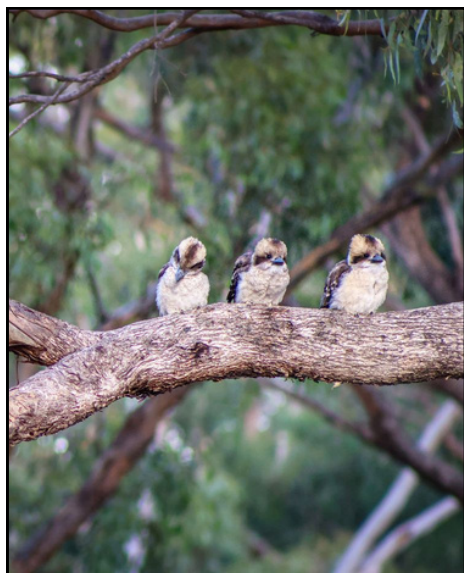
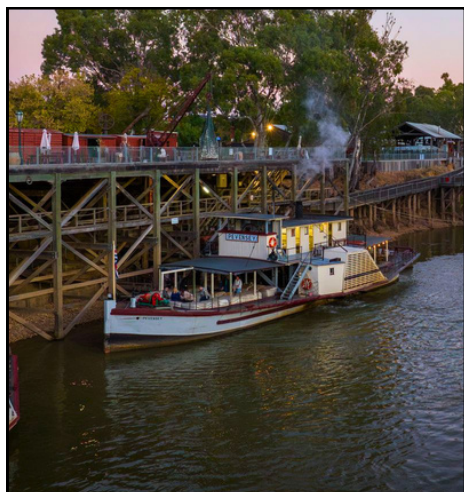
This morning, a local guide introduces you to the story of Echuca, pointing out the areas of interest along the port and sharing tales of the colourful characters who crewed the old river boats. At the Port of Echuca Discovery Centre, walk the path of the town's river pioneering spirit, learning how the bustling river trade shaped the town. Then board the PS Pevensey for a short cruise along the majestic Murray River.

This afternoon, your coach carries you from Echuca to Torrumbarry, where the PS Australian Star waits at her mooring. Step aboard into a world of timeless river charm, settle into your private stateroom, and mark the occasion with a traditional afternoon Devonshire tea as she gets underway, your first taste of life on the Murray.

Get acquainted with your fellow travellers on deck, or drop by the wheelhouse for a chat with the skipper about the vessel's authentic wood-fired steam engine and her place in paddle steamer history, or simply retreat to your stateroom and let the river ease you into holiday mode.

As the sun dips low, drinks begin in the saloon, local wine or craft beer in hand while the bushland stirs with birdsong and kangaroos emerge from the shadows. Dinner is a highlight: a chef-prepared welcome feast of fresh, locally sourced ingredients. We moor for the night at Norris Bend, where, weather permitting, a crackling riverside campfire awaits under a blanket of stars, new friends and stories close at hand.

FLAVOUR & RIVERSIDE STORIES

DAY 3 | Tuesday 31 August 2027 (BLD)

After a hearty breakfast, PS Australian Star cruises to the storied Perricoota Station — first settled by James Maiden in 1843, and familiar to television audiences as a filming location for All the Rivers Run, where the paddlesteamer PS Emmylou once played the fictional PS Providence.

From here, a short excursion takes you to Murray Gums Estate, a boutique producer of premium wines and award-winning olive oils — exclusive to PS Australian Star guests. Meet the passionate owners, wander the estate, and enjoy a gourmet lunch paired with estate-grown wine and olive oil tastings.

Back at Perricoota Station, your Captain leads a further leisurely walk through the beautifully restored buildings and manicured riverside gardens as the afternoon turns to evening. Happy Hour begins on board with golden light bathing the river, followed by dinner served alfresco on deck, overlooking the grandeur of the station. As night falls, settle in under the stars for Movie Night, featuring Riverboats Remembered — a historical documentary tracing the paddle steamer era through rare archival footage from the early 1900s to the mid-1970s.

DAY 4 | Wednesday 1 September 2027 (BLD)

For early risers and photography enthusiasts, morning mist over Perricoota Station makes for a magical start — watch for native wildlife stirring along the banks, best enjoyed with a warm cup in hand.

After breakfast, PS Australian Star steams onward toward tonight's mooring at the tranquil Layfield Lane — a day made for pure relaxation. Lounge on the sun deck with a book, watch the ever-changing scenery drift by, or simply savour the gentle rhythm of the river.

As evening falls, the day builds to a signature riverside moment — our much-loved Australian BBQ dinner* under the stars. Soft candlelight and a crackling nearby campfire set a warm, welcoming scene, with live entertainment to enjoy as you share stories and laughter with fellow guests beneath the southern sky. Retire to your stateroom with the sounds of the bush all around.

HISTORY & HERITAGE

DAY 5 | Thursday 2 September 2027 (BLD)

Breakfast aboard fuels a fascinating half-day exploring Echuca's rich history. Disembark for the Henry Hopwood Town Tour, a guided journey through the town's historic heart that uncovers the stories behind landmarks such as Hopwood's Punt and the innovative pontoon bridge—the original Murray River crossing devised by Echuca's founder, Henry Hopwood.

Then step aboard the lovingly restored PS Canberra, a 115-year-old paddlesteamer built in 1912 from sturdy red gum timber, and cruise the river as she once did at the height of the paddle steamer era. Afterwards, enjoy free time for a self-guided walk through the Port of Echuca precinct, museums, heritage buildings, artisan shops, and cafes at your own pace. Return to PS Australian Star for lunch as the journey continues, cruising past the imposing Port of Echuca Wharf, once home to more than 100 paddle steamers during its 19th-century heyday. In the evening, gather for a farewell dinner aboard, cruising near Echuca — a chance to reflect on the journey, share stories with fellow guests, and toast to the Murray one last time.

DAY 6 | Friday 3 September 2027 (BD)

The Trail of Lights is a transcendent experience, allowing you to connect with both the artwork and the natural environment. Through the interplay of 12,500 firefly lights, Gone Fishing sculptures, and the natural landscape, Munro invites contemplation and reflection, creating a space for introspection and wonder. MILDURA AND WENTWORTH

DAY 7 | Saturday 4 September 2027 (BLD)

We start our day with a visit to Woodsies Gem Shop, Australia's largest gemstone-cutting and jewellery-manufacturing complex. It's a fascinating place where we can browse through collections of fossils, jewellery, and crystals. Next, we head to Varapodio Estate, a family-owned and operated olive grove. Enjoy a talk on their farm as well as tastings of their award-winning oils before lunch here.

This afternoon you have time at leisure to unwind before we travel to Wentworth to experience the awe-inspiring Fibre Optic Symphonic Orchestra (FOSO) installation, set against the Perry Sandhills. The setup features 80 Hills Hoist clotheslines arranged like an orchestra pit, complete with a dazzling display of colours and sounds. Each clothesline is lit with fibre optic lights representing different musical instruments, creating a symphonic visual and audio feast you won't want to miss. After a fun-filled evening, we return to our accommodation.

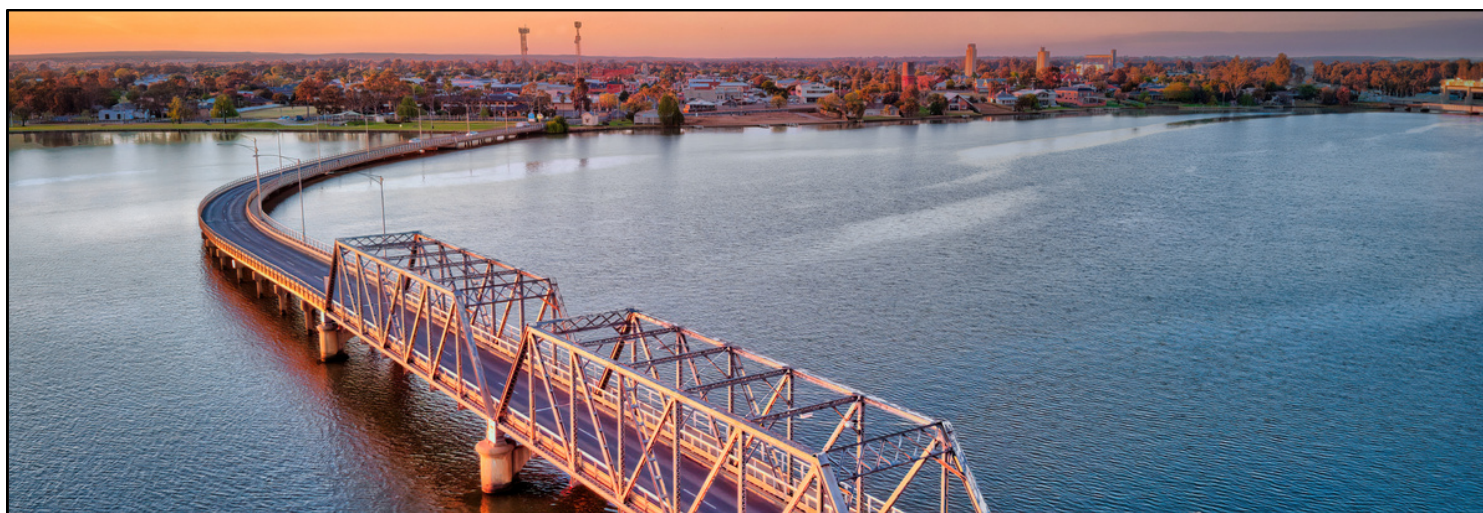
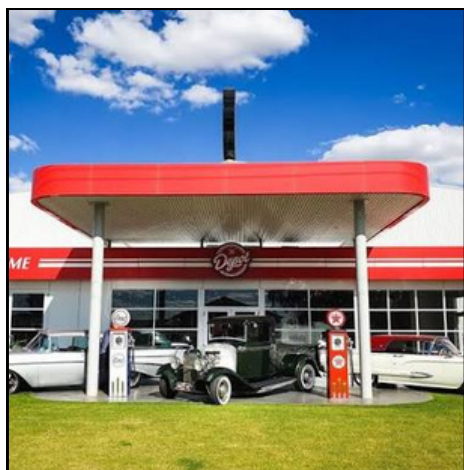
MILDURA TO YARRAWONGA

LOCAL TOURING

DAY 9 | Monday 6 September 2027 (BLD)

This morning we make our way to Tocumwal. Here we learn about the significant, unique and secret part of Australia's civil aviation history at the Tocumwal Aviation Museum. The museum showcases the first aeroplane landing at Tocumwal in September 1919 through the barnstorming days of the 1920s and early regional airlines in the 1930s and more. Heading to Katamatite, we stop to visit the incredible silo painted by Tim Bowtell, which holds significant importance to the Lions Club and entire community. For lunch we visit a fascinating colonial house, Byramine Homestead. Built in 1842 by the famous explorer Hamilton Hume for his sister-in-law Elizabeth and her nine children after her husband was murdered by Bushrangers. The house was built in an octagonal shape to provide a clear view of all angles in case of an attack.

Tonight, travel out to the banks of Bullanginya Lagoon for Bullanginya Dreaming, combining an unforgettable journey through the Indigenous history of the region featuring a mesmerising laser light show. Bullanginya Dreaming features 12 unique activations, each telling its own district story. Through immersive art experiences and heritage celebration, it cultivates unity, respect and appreciation for the rich legacy of the Bangerang people. Dinner will be at Barooga Sports Club before returning to our accommodation.

This 10-day tour combines relaxed river cruising with light-to-moderate walking at each stop (generally 1–3 km per day). Several heritage sites (Port of Echuca, Perricoota Station) involve uneven or cobbled surfaces, and two evening activities — the FOSO installation at Perry Sandhills and Bullanginya Dreaming — take place on uneven or sandy ground in low light. Enclosed, supportive footwear is essential, and a torch is recommended for evening activities. Guests who use a walking aid can join most activities; please contact us to discuss the Perry Sandhills and Bullanginya Dreaming stops specifically before booking.

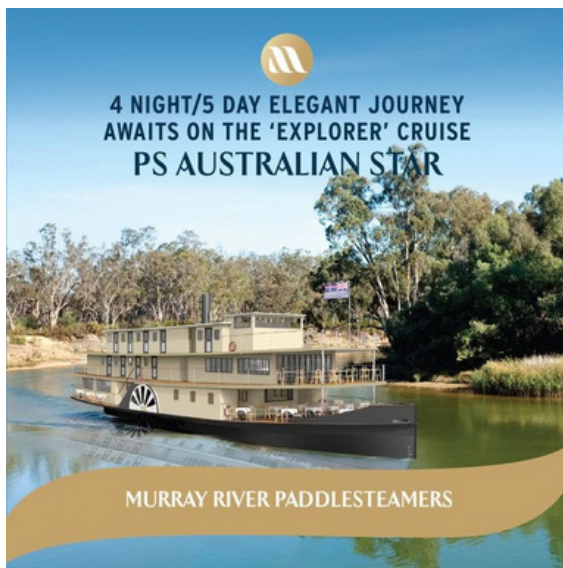
